

  - Normative-per capita funding for bachelor's and master's programs in state funded higher education institutions




# Research orientation in higher educational institutions with different status



# Do research activities help to teach?




- Teaching and research are hardly compatible with each other (agree or strongly agree)
- Your research activities reinforce your teaching




# Faculty time allocation


(hours per week)
